2008 Volunteer Positions

(Please note: All volunteers must be 18 years of age or older).

Parade Route District Volunteers

The parade route is divided into several districts each with a District Manager. Those districts are comprised of vendors, pre-parade entertainment, radio stations, bleachers, etc. Help monitor a specific district before and during the parade to make sure that everything is running smoothly.

- High visibility along the parade route – great opportunity for branded volunteers
- Estimated arrival time: 3:00-4:00pm

End of Parade Disband

Where do all the participants go at the end of the Parade route? Find out on the End of Parade Disband team.

Volunteers direct units to their appropriate disband area and insure that units maintain speed.

- Great opportunity for branded volunteers
- Estimated arrival time: 4:30pm

Band Liaisons

What is a parade without marching bands? Band liaisons will assist with the coordination of bands and band buses on parade day.

- Opportunity to be involved behind the scenes
- Estimated arrival time: 3:00pm

Line-up and Staging

Our line-up committee monitors the incoming units as they enter Harbor Park, the Parade staging area, and wait to be “integrated” into the line-of-march. Be prepared to direct units to their appropriate waiting place and usher them into integration.

- Opportunity to be involved behind the scenes
- Estimated arrival time: 1:00pm

Parking Assistants

Like being the gate keeper? Parking Assistants staff all parking lots and areas assigned to volunteers and participants. Only with an official pass will someone be allowed behind the scenes.

- Estimated Shift Times: Shift 1 – 12pm - 4:30pm; Shift 2 – 4:00pm - 8:30pm.

Logistics Team (AKA – “The Fly Squad”)

This is where all the action takes place and is one of the most important volunteer jobs needed for the Grand Illumination Parade. The Logistics Team works behind the scenes on parade day to make sure all the proper equipment is in place for the big event. A truck and driver will be provided. This volunteer assignment involves a full day commitment on Saturday, November 22nd. (9:30am until approximately 11pm with a break mid-day.)
