MISSION

The Downtown 100 is a highly motivated group of 100 volunteers who live or work downtown and who volunteer their services to support the vision and mission of the Downtown Norfolk Council.

<u>OBJECTIVES</u>

Leadership Development

Downtown 100 members are the emerging community leaders. The Downtown 100 provides members opportunities to become better informed about community issues and tools to enhance their leadership skills.

Community Awareness & Involvement

The Downtown 100 sponsors issue-related forums that allow members to meet with city and regional leaders. Downtown 100 members are also provided the opportunity to attend Downtown Norfolk Council events and briefings. These forums and briefings are vehicles that serve to inform and involve members in issues relevant to the downtown community.

Networking & Volunteerism

The Downtown 100 provides members with both volunteer and networking activities. Social functions provide opportunities for networking and friendship. Volunteer efforts provide a meaningful service to the downtown community and therefore to the economic health of our region.

Downtown 100 Membership

The Membership Liaison is a position on the Steering Committee whose purpose is three-fold. First, to review new member applications and make recommendations on who meets the organizations guidelines and which committee would best suit them. Second, recruiting new members to the organization. Third, to help keep members engaged and enforce the membership guidelines below:

- Membership requires that the applicant must live or work in Downtown Norfolk or work for an organization who is a member of the Downtown Norfolk Council.
- Commit to membership of one year to renew by mutual choice on the first day of each calendar year.
- Must be an active member of a committee and annually must attend at least 75% of your monthly committee meetings.
- Must attend at least 4 DT100 sponsored events, projects or socials during the calendar year.
- Must attend at least 1 Downtown Norfolk Council meeting or function during the calendar year.
- Must agree to volunteer to support the DT100's projects. A minimum of 10 hours of volunteer support per year is required.

Goals:

•To recruit and retain 100 engaged members of the Downtown 100.

- •Reached 100 members in October 2011.
- Integrated Exit Surveys for all members who resign to gain a better knowledge of why members leave the organization and improve the overall experience for current and future members.
- Created a more structured New Member Orientation so that new members know exactly what is expected of them and how to get the most of their time in the Downtown 100.
- Developed a Member Survey to be rolled out at the beginning of next year to gauge member interest and involvement and collect any thoughts on how to improve the organization as a whole.

Downtown 100 Civic Engagement Task Force

A primary objective of the Downtown 100 is to foster an environment where members are informed and actively engaged in the Civic process. From taking an informed position on items of civic interest, particularly as they pertain to the future of downtown Norfolk, to the preparation of Downtown 100 for leadership positions within the City of Norfolk, active civic engagement is important.

This year, a task force of Downtown 100 members examined the issue of improving the depth and breadth of the civic engagement of our membership. The work done by this task force will be factored in to the organizational planning for the next fiscal year.

Goals

- Introduce new activities to the DT100 membership.
- Provide a volunteer opportunity every month.
- Provide a variety of activities to meet different needs.
- Start supporting non-profit groups that our membership work for or are involved with.
- 7 to 10 member volunteers for each project. 2/3 of those to be from a committee other than projects.

- Held 2nd Annual American Red Cross Blood Drive, collecting 21 pints of blood with the potential to save up to 60 lives.
- Continued to work with the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia by sorting food for Hampton Roads' needy families and children.
 Over 4,500 pounds of food was organized into categories.
- Organized 6th Annual ForKids Career Day at the City of Norfolk with 25 children participating. This year the light rail was incorporated into the event, a huge hit with the kids.
- Organized "Clean the Hague" in conjunction with Keep Norfolk Beautiful Day. Numerous volunteers collected debris along 2 miles of the Hague waterfront.
- Organized the 4th Annual Food Drive for the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia with 11 downtown office buildings staging collection centers to help reach our goal this year of 2,000 pounds of food.
- Coordinated volunteers to support the Grand Illumination Parade.
- Coordinated 60 volunteers and organized a welcoming social event for crews of the visiting vessels at OpSail 2012.
